HCL has been contributing toward the athletes and para-athletes supported by OGQ for years. The last year's performance by the OGQsupported players has been tremendous.

OGQ athletes have won 33 medals out of a total of 38 medals won by India at the Asian Games 2022 in OGQ-focused sports. At the Asian Paga Games, 54 medals won by OGQ para athletes out the 94 won by India in OGQ-focused sports.
